

# SELF DRIVE IN THE KRUGER

Hazyview is the "Gateway" to the southern part of the Kruger National Park, as well to the spectacular Panorama Escarpment with its waterfalls, forests and scenic views from God's Window and the Blyde River Canyon. The name "Hazyview" aptly describes the hazy, lazy days during summers, typical of the African Bushveld whilst on Safari. Hazyview is central to the Kruger Lowveld Region of Mpumalanga, South Africa and is located amongst sub-tropical fruit orchards, close to the renowned Kruger National Park.



# DAY TRIPPING ITINERARY

### The Kruger National Park – self drive

Pack your picnic basket and head off early into the Kruger National Park through the Phabeni Gate. The **Phabeni Gate** is situated approximately 12kms from the Kruger Park Lodge.

In summer the gate opens at between 05h00 and 05h30 and in winter at 06h00 (varies depending on the month). During Peak Season the Gate is busy, so it is recommended to book in advance to guarantee your entrance into the Park. You can book by contacting the Gate directly on 013 735 5890 – once they have made the reservation, they will direct you to their online secured payment platform – payment needs to be processed same day to avoid an auto cancellation. The rates vary: SA Residents – Approx R120 / SADC Residents – Approx R220 / Foreign Passports – Approx R450. All visitors to the Kruger National Park must produce a valid form of IDENTIFICATION (Driver's License / ID / Passport etc....). It is recommended to purchase a Kruger Map Book to guide you through the Park (available at CNA / Exclusive Books, or once inside the Park). The Park offers numerous Picnic and Braai / BBQ spots, so be sure to pack your picnic hamper. Alcohol is not allowed to be taken into the Park; however it can be purchased once inside the Park at one of the Rest Camps. The Rest Camps do offer Refreshment facilities, Fuel, Shop, and a Restaurant. https://www.sanparks.org/parks/kruger/tourism/day visitors.php



**Driving behaviour:** Drive slowly. But not too slowly. The best speed is to drive between 20 and 30km/h. Keep your eyes on the bush next to the road and look through the bushes.

Respect animals, they have the right of way: Especially those that are bigger than your car. Elephants can be dangerous, so keep your distance. Most animals are unpredictable and it is very difficult to judge an animal's mood. Never block the animal's path / direction, always reverse or move ahead, but don't block their way.

Getting out of your vehicle: Only do so once at a rest camp, or picnic site. With predators in the area, keep your windows up at all times.



There are several picnic stops between Rest Camps where you can hire a skottel braai to cook up your eggs and bacon, or purchase take-aways directly from the small on-site shops.

- Afsaal located on H3 between Skukuza and Malelane has a small restaurant and braai area.
   Tables and chairs are situated under the shady trees.
- Nkuhlu- located on H4-1 between Skukuza and Lower Sabie on the banks of the Sabie River has a small takeaway and skottels can be hired (take care of the pesty monkeys, always trying to steal your food). Most gorgeous views over the Sabie river.
- Tshokwane— on the H1-3 approximately midway between Skukuza and Satara and between Lower Sabie and Satara— has a small take-away, skottels for hire and traditional foods available (peak season). Monkeys abound here too). Newly refurbed with shaded cover.
- Nhlanguleni on the S36 approximately midway between Skukuza and Orpen. A secret place.... Quiet with no shop, however skottles can be hired. Offers views over a water-hole that always has animals; zebras, giraffes, elephants, bushpigs and the occasional lion or two and so on... This is the Kruger, you never know what you will see next.
